VENERABLE MOTHER VERONICA OF THE PASSION

The Founder of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation

(1823- 1906)



Mother Veronica, nee Sophie Levees, was born in 1823 in a pious, cultured, English, Anglican family. She was gifted with singular talents of mind and heart which were nurtured by sound education and wide experience. In spite of her mother's strong opposition she embraced the Catholic faith in 1850. God took possession of her heart so powerfully that she first broke off her engagement to a Marine Officer, whom she loved, and then responded generously to the call to Religious life. She entered the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition in 1851, taking the name, Sister Mary Veronica of the Passion.

Mother Veronica was ardent and full of Zeal to work for the missions in India. When she was sent to found a house of the Congregation at Calicut in 1862 she responded to an inner call and under the guidance of Father Marie-Ephrem O.C.D., discovered her vocation to found a Third Order Regular of Active Carmelites to serve the need of faith-formation through education of young girls of the West Coast of India. After receiving the required permission from Rome, Mother Veronica painfully left her Congregation to enter the Carmel of Pau, France in 1867. On Completion of her novitiate and First Profession, she left Pau and founded the Apostolic Carmel at Bayonne France in 1868, after facing many hardships in her relentless search for God's will.

The first group of Apostolic Carmelites arrived in India on 19th of November 1870 and were established in the diocese of Mangalore. Unfavorable circumstances obliged Mother Veronica to close the convent at Bayonne in 1873, after which she re-entered the Carmel of Pau as a Cloistered Carmelite. After a period of twelve years in a new foundation at Bethlehem, Mother Veronica returned to Pau in 1887. Her life of loving surrender to God in Challenging circumstances culminated in her holy death in 1906.

Mother Veronica's heroic obedience to the will of God, her life of profound faith and prayer, her wholehearted commitment to the Cross, her outstanding humility and zeal for the Missions remain an inspiration to all those who, following the footsteps of Christ, seek to offer their lives in loving service of humanity, specially the less privileged.

MOTHER MARYALOYSIA A.C.
A Great Educationist and the Pioneer of A.C. Education
(1855 to 1939)



A keen witted, wide in outlook and sympathy, a sharp judge of character, outspoken in defense of truth, clinging fiercely to principle, Mother Aloysia was none-the-less gentle, cheerful and kind. She stood at the pilot's wheel for eighteen long years over a critical period. In 1926 the Constitutions were sent to the Holy See and the Decree of Praise obtained. It was a red letter day in the history of the A.C. It was spring time in the field of A.C. education, with schools renewed, new ones built, syllabi revised and modernized. The crown of her educational work was Saint Agnes First Grade College, the first Catholic Women's College, which today has more than a thousand young girls on its rolls. In the field of education her name still conjures up a vision, restores ideals and awakens inspiration.

PREAMBLE

Carmel School (CBSE) Moodbidri is a Christian Minority Organization started in the year 2013 is managed by the Apostolic Carmel Sisters under the Apostolic Carmel Educational Society (R) for the total welfare of the people for promoting the cause of Education. The Apostolic Carmel Congregation was started by Mother Veronica in the year 1868 in Bayonne, France. Further it was established in St. Ann's Campus Bolar, Mangalore in 1870 with its main thrust being the development of women as persons imbued with deep faith in God thus providing sound education to them. The educational efforts of the pioneers have now spread not only in India but also to Sri Lanka, Kuwait, Bahrain, Pakistan, Italy, Germany and East Africa Region. P.N: Parents are expected to contact the school office only in case of any emergency or regarding clarification of any important matter related to school. However are not permitted to visit their wards or any teacher in the classroom during school hours.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

1. Every candidate for admission and withdrawal must be introduced by letter or in person by one who is responsible to the Principal for her. Additional letter from the school for withdrawal to be submitted along with the letter.
2. Pupils coming from other Secondary Schools and Primary Schools should produce “Original Transfer Certificate” issued by the Head of the school concerned.
3. Applications for admission should be made in the prescribed form which can be obtained from the office and should be submitted along with the Transfer Certificate from the school last attended. Every pupil on admission shall pay the prescribed fees.
4. The Application for Admission must be signed by the father or mother or in their absence by a guardian who has been authorized by the parents to do so. This letter of authorization must be submitted along with the admission form.
5. In the case of the admission of pupils coming from Primary Schools or Secondary Schools the Date of Birth as furnished in the Transfer Certificate will be taken into consideration.
6. No alteration in the Date of Birth will be made without the sanction of the C.P.I. in Karnataka, Bengaluru.
7. The application form should be filled in correctly with regard to all the information asked for.
8. The application form should be registered at the school office within the prescribed date.

9. No Transfer Certificate will be issued to a pupil whose fee is not paid.
10. Pupils joining or leaving in the middle of the term must settle all dues before taking any certificate.
11. A duplicate copy of any Certificate will not be issued except for very good and sufficient reasons in which case an additional fine will be levied. In case of a Transfer Certificate an affidavit has to be produced.
12. Certificates will be issued a day after the receipt of application for the same.
13. Pupils coming from schools outside the State will be admitted on production of the Transfer certificate duly countersigned by the inspecting officer in charge of the institution in strict conformity with the table of parity of standards issued by the Department.



SCHOOL FEE STRUCTURE & PAYMENTS

Carmel School is a self financing school with no grants from the State or Central Governments. The fee structure is to meet the developmental and recurring expenditure the major one being salaries of the staff. Hence salaries, developmental activities and the mounting maintenance costs require substantial sum of money. Obviously fee raise on a yearly basis to match the current salaries and other costs is inevitable.

The School Management strictly advises the parents to make the **payment of School fees (1st Installment) at the time of admission** through **D.D.** only. The payment of 2nd Installment needs to be done strictly by 31st October 2024 through Neverskip app or D.D.

No pupil will be admitted to school until she/ he has paid admission fees for the Academic Year.

NOTE: Fees will not be refunded to Parents for any reason during any part of the Academic Year.

GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

1. Every working day from Monday to Friday is divided into two sessions. The morning session commences at 8.40 a.m. and concludes at 12.40 p.m. and the afternoon session extends from 1.10 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. The working hours on Saturdays are from 8.40 a.m. to 12.30p.m.
2. The time between 8.40 a.m. and 8.50 a.m. will be a study time. The students should sit in their respective classrooms and spend the time in useful study. No student should be found loitering about during the study time. They are expected to be in time for classes. ***Late comers will be marked PL (Present but late)***. On the teacher's arrival into the classroom the pupils must rise, pray, salute the teacher and then take their seats. When the attendance is called each one must rise and answer to her name.

3. **Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to school work, obscenity in word or act are sufficient reasons for the temporary or permanent dismissal of a pupil. Minor offences such as coming late to class, damaging school property etc., are punishable by a fine.**
4. The school does not hold itself responsible for the pupils' conduct outside its premises. It however takes cognizance of any serious misconduct of its pupils committed outside its premises and should any serious charge be fairly substantiated the guilty shall be punished according to the gravity of the offence.
5. **Students should wear the uniform as prescribed by the school on all days. Students should wear the school prescribed shoes and socks only. However black sandals are allowed only during the rainy season from June to September.**

6. **Long and painted nails, ornaments such as bangles, rings, chains, flowers and bracelets are strictly forbidden in the school. No ornaments, fancy watches/spectacles should be worn to school. The school is not responsible for lost goods. Use of Mehendi is not allowed under any circumstances. Colouring of the hair, using eye-liner is not allowed.**
7. Hair if long should be in two plaits tied with black ribbons if short the hair should be above the collar of the dress tied with two pony's.

8. All correspondence addressed to the school is subject to scrutiny by the Principal.
9. Under no circumstances once a student answers her roll shall she/he leave the school premises without the permission of the Principal till the end of the session.
10. Visitors, Parents or guardians will not be allowed to communicate with any student during working hours without the permission of the Principal.
11. Presents to teachers or celebrations in their honour are not allowed without the Principal's permission.
12. Collection or borrowing of money, buying or selling of anything among the children is prohibited/no permission
13. No child will be permitted to be in class during the common programmes and the physical training periods unless permitted by the Principal.
14. Books, magazines, newspapers etc., not approved by the Principal should not be brought to the school.
15. Books, umbrellas, rain-coats, stationery, tiffin's, etc., should have a name or mark by which the owner can easily come to know. All stray or unclaimed property should be brought to the Principal's Office.
16. **No student or staff member will be called to the phone during school hours. In case of urgency however messages received over the phone in school office will be conveyed to them.**
17. Pupils must not join any clubs or societies or make any engagements that would interfere with their studies without the Principal's permission.
18. No subscriptions are allowed without previous permission of the Principal.

19. Pupils should adhere to the **DISCIPLINE of the school** whole heartedly. They should follow the bells scrupulously particularly bells given after the recess time both at forenoon and afternoon. They should never leave the school premises in between intervals.
20. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not allowed. No student is permitted to enter any classroom other than her own, without permission.
21. **All the students must possess a copy of the school calendar which is to be brought to class on all working days. They are not permitted to tear any page from the Calendar.**
22. **The students are expected to speak in English only within the school premises.**
23. The students must equip themselves with the complete outfit of everything that is necessary for their studies. They must use their own materials and be responsible for their safety. The school cannot make itself responsible for books, money, clothes and other articles that are lost.
24. The students who depend on public conveyance to come to school should leave their homes early enough to avoid peak hours and reach the school well in time.
25. The students are not allowed to take part in political agitation directed against the authority of the lawful Government.
26. Attendance at classes and examinations, progress as well as conduct of the students will be taken into consideration while recommending the students for merit certificate, scholarship and free ships.
27. **Students are not permitted to go outside the campus during lunch break.**
28. **Dress Code: Whenever the students are exempted from wearing the school uniform, they are required to observe the**

norms of **Simplicity, Modesty and Propriety** with regard to dress as per the school Standards. Be neat and modest. Parents will be held responsible to see that their ward follow the regulations laid down in the matter of dress.

29. It is mandatory to wear the prescribed school uniform regularly by the students. Any additional like scarf, burqua, shawl and other objectionable gear are not permitted to be worn with the uniform in the school campus.
30. Students are not permitted either individually or in group to hold activities or worship other than those organized by the school authority within the campus.
31. Smoking and consumption of alcohol/use of drugs is a punishable offence. Expulsion may be the consequence of such action.
32. Students are forbidden from entering the laboratories except with the permission of the teacher in charge. All equipment and materials given to students for practical work should maintain an observation record book which should be regularly submitted. Students who are irregular in practical work are not eligible for promotion to next class.
33. Library, Computer Lab and Laboratories are significant and integral assets of the school. Huge amount is invested into them. Students are expected to use them with great care. Any loss or damage will have to be replaced or made good by the student concerned.
34. Misuse of Social Networking (eg. Face book, Twitter etc.) tarnishing the image of the institution, the Management, a staff member, a student for that matter anybody who's part of the school will lead to legal action as per the cyber crime regulation.
35. The "Open House Day" will be organized after every test/Exam which gives an opportunity for a meaningful exchange of views between parents and teachers to bring about a better

understanding of individual concerns. Absence of students and non attendance of parents on “Open House Day” will result in the report being retained till a future date which will be intimated to parents.

36. On Birthdays students wear their regular school uniform and not the coloured dress. They are strictly prohibited to cut the cake in the classroom or distribute cake, ice cream, costly chocolates to fellow students. Ordinary sweets could be distributed but not compulsory.

TESTS, EXAMS AND PROMOTION

1. The Assessment structure and examination comprises of two terms and each Term consists of.

(a) Periodic Assessment - 20 Marks

(b) Half yearly and yearly written Exam - 80 Marks

Besides this students’ performance will be assessed continuously in various ways such as class work, assignments, projects, participation in classroom learning, neatness, self-discipline and systematic completion of class work and study etc. Assessment will be informal most of the time but it’ll be an ongoing process. Students are expected to spend time daily on personal study.

2. Achievement Records/ Academic Performance Reports will have to be seen at school and signed by the parent whenever they are asked to do so. Students also should accompany the parents on that day. Only grades will be given in their records.
3. The students who absent themselves from any test or examination for valid reasons should get prior permission from the head of the institution. In case of illness a Medical Certificate should be submitted. **Therefore any absence from test or examination without permission will be viewed seriously and suitable action will be taken.**

4. **In case of absence during the exam due to any reasons no re-test will be given to the students similarly no test will be conducted before the time.**
5. **The students who pass in all the subjects in all the tests and examinations during the year are eligible for Merit Certificates.** If absence for any test then the students are not eligible for the same.
6. The students who are absent for the Tests and Annual Examinations for any reason will not be promoted.
7. Every student must put in at least 90% attendance in order to merit promotion to the higher class. Those who have a shortage of attendance will not be permitted to appear for the Annual Examination.
8. A student must be advised to leave the school at the end of the year if his/ her conduct has not been satisfactory.
9. Malpractice in Tests and Examinations is a serious offence and therefore it will not be tolerated. The student who has recourse to malpractice in the Annual Examination will not be promoted to the higher class.
10. **No candidate will be permitted to appear for the Annual Examinations or the Public Examinations unless she/ he has fulfilled the conditions regarding attendance, progress, conduct and the payment of school fees.**

1. ಕ್ಲಪ್ತೆ ಮತ್ತು ಕ್ರಮಬದ್ಧ ಹಾಜರಾತಿಯನ್ನು ಸರಿಯಾಗಿ ಪಾಲಿಸತಕ್ಕದು. ಮದುವೆ, ಶವ ಸಂಸ್ಕಾರ ಮೊದಲಾದವುಗಳಿಗೆ ಹೋಗಬೇಕಾದಲ್ಲಿ ಶಾಲಾ ಕ್ಯಾಲೆಂಡರ್‌ನಲ್ಲಿ ನಮೂದಿತವಾದ ಸ್ಥಳದಲ್ಲಿ ಹೆತ್ತವರು ಯಾ ರಕ್ಷಕರಿಂದ ಲಿಖಿತವಾಗಿ ತಂದು ಮುಖ್ಯೋಪಾಧ್ಯಾಯನಿಯ ಮೊದಲಾಗಿ ಅನುಮತಿ ಪಡೆದಿರಬೇಕು. ನಿರ್ದಿಷ್ಟವಾದ ಕಾರಣವಿಲ್ಲದೆ ರಜೆಯನ್ನು ಮನ್ನಿಸಲಾಗುವುದಿಲ್ಲ.
2. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿನಿಯ ಅಸೌಖ್ಯದಂತಹ ಕಾರಣಗಳಿಂದ ಮೊದಲು ಸೂಚಿಸದೆ ಗೈರು ಹಾಜರಿಯಾದಲ್ಲಿ, ಮತ್ತೆ ತರಗತಿಗೆ ಬರುವಾಗ ಶಾಲಾ ಕ್ಯಾಲೆಂಡರ್‌ನಲ್ಲಿ ಹೆತ್ತವರ ಯಾ ರಕ್ಷಕರಿಂದ ಸಹಿ ಮಾಡಿದ ರಜೆ ಅರ್ಜಿಯನ್ನು ತರತಕ್ಕದ್ದು.

5. ಶಾಲೆಯ ವಠಾರದ ಹೊರಗೆ ಕಂಡು ಬಂದ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಯ ನಡತೆಗೆ ಶಾಲೆಯು ಹೊಣೆಯಲ್ಲ. ಹೀಗಿದ್ದರೂ ದುರ್ನಡತೆಯು ಅಸಾಮಾನ್ಯವೆಂದು ಕಂಡು ಬಂದಲ್ಲಿ ಅದನ್ನು ಅಪರಾಧವೆಂದು ಪರಿಗಣಿಸಿ, ಅಂಥವರ ಮೇಲೆ ಶಿಸ್ತಿನ ಕ್ರಮಗಳನ್ನು ಕೈಗೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗುವುದು.

1. ಶಾಲೆಯ ಶಿಸ್ತನ್ನು ಪಾಲಿಸುವಲ್ಲಿ ಕ್ರಮಬದ್ಧವಾದ ಓದಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಮಕ್ಕಳು ನಿರತರಾಗಿರುವಂತೆ ನೋಡಿಕೊಳ್ಳುವಲ್ಲಿ, ಹೆತ್ತವರು ಶಾಲೆಯ ಅಧಿಕಾರಿಗಳೊಂದಿಗೆ ಸಹಕರಿಸಬೇಕು. ರಜಾ ದಿನಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಕಲಿಯಲು ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಸಮಯವನ್ನು ಉಪಯೋಗಿಸುವುದು. ಸರಿಯಾದ ಹಾಜರಿ ಮತ್ತು ಮನೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ಕಲಿಕೆಯನ್ನು ಹೆತ್ತವರು ಪ್ರೋತ್ಸಾಹಿಸದಿದ್ದರೆ, ಪಲಿತಾಂಶವು ನಿರಾಶದಾಯಕವಾಗುವುದು.

4. ತಮ್ಮ ಮಕ್ಕಳು ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಮತ್ತು ಕಾರ್ಯಾನುಭವಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ವಿಶೇಷ ಆಸಕ್ತಿ ವಹಿಸುವಂತೆ ಪ್ರೋತ್ಸಾಹಿಸಬೇಕು.
5. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಯು ತೇರ್ಗಡೆಯಾಗಬೇಕಾಗಿದ್ದರೆ ಶೇ. 90 ಹಾಜರಾತಿಯನ್ನು ಪಡೆದಿರಬೇಕು. ಅಲ್ಲದೆ ಕಾರ್ಯಾನುಭವ, ಲಲಿತ ಕಲೆಗಳು, ಶಾರೀರಿಕ ಶಿಕ್ಷಣದಲ್ಲಿಯೂ ಸರಿಯಾಗಿ ಭಾಗವಹಿಸಿರಬೇಕು.
6. 'ಮನೆಪಾಠ' [Tutions] ದುಷ್ಟರಿಣಾಮವನ್ನು ಬೀರುವುದರಿಂದ ಅದನ್ನು ಪ್ರೋತ್ಸಾಹಿಸಬಾರದು. ಅಂತಹ ಅವಶ್ಯಕತೆಯಿದ್ದಲ್ಲಿ ಮಾತ್ರ ಅದನ್ನು ಏರ್ಪಡಿಸಬಹುದು. ಆದರೆ ಶಾಲೆಯು ಇದರ ಜವಾಬ್ದಾರಿಯನ್ನು ವಹಿಸುವುದಿಲ್ಲ.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS/ GUARDIANS TOWARDS THEIR WARDS

1. Parents play a decisive role in the development of students in their formative years. Therefore the school expects the whole hearted co-operation from the parents.
2. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline by advising and guiding their children to study their lessons daily and to take an active and salutary interest in the activities of the school.
3. Parents are particularly requested to Sign Messages, Progress Reports, Weekly Reports or any other similar documents when so requested. Failure to do this may put their children to great inconvenience and render them liable to be sent home. **Repeatedly coming late or forgetting to bring relevant books may be punished in the same way.**
4. Parents are invited to meet the Principal and other members of the staff personally especially when unsatisfactory attendance or progress of their wards is brought to their notice. **Parents are free to meet the teachers from 3.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. only and not during class hours.**
5. Parents are requested not to give extra money to their children other than for travel. If any payment is made to the school a receipt should be demanded (in particular for school fees).
6. Private tuitions are not encouraged.
7. Parents are requested to see that their children do not come to school wearing gold bangles, chains, finger rings, showy earrings or any other costly ornaments.
8. Parents/ Guardians are advised not to give any gift to the teachers.
9. Parents are requested not to allow children to bring CDs, iPods, Cameras, mobile phones, video games or similar gadgets to the school. There will be surprise checking and if a student is found with any of these gadgets the same will be confiscated and will not be returned. Any violation of this rule will attract disciplinary action.

10. It is always advisable that the parents go through any new material like cartoons or CDs you buy for them before they start watching them.
11. Parents are discouraged strongly from visiting the school staff at their residences except in an emergency.
12. Criticism of the school authority /staff in the presence of the students should be avoided. Legitimate complaints should be brought to the notice of the Principal without delay. Anonymous letters/phone calls will not be considered.
13. All dues must be cleared before a student is admitted to the terminal/final examinations.
14. Attending the GBM, PTA meetings and Orientation program organized for parents as well as other important functions in the school is a duty and service parents owe to their wards’.
15. All communication from the school regarding home work, assignments, projects, tests, exams, competitions, payment of school fees, class work etc will be sent through Neverskip app. The parents are expected compulsorily to go through the messages and respond positively.
16. All doctor’s appointments should be made outside school hours only.
17. If there is any grievance against the staff members parents are expected to bring it to the notice of the Principal. Parents are not permitted to tackle the staff members directly.
18. Any requests or complaints should be given in writing to the Principal.
19. Do encourage your ward to excel in academics and in all the curricular/co-curricular and extra-curricular activities organized by the school.
20. Keep the child at home when suffering from contagious or infectious diseases.

21. If parents need to take their ward between school hours on emergency cases a written letter needs to be produced to the Principal and personally come over to pick them up. Other than parents if you are deputing any immediate relative (only in emergency cases) an authorization letter signed by the parents and the parent ID card is a must to pick up your ward.
22. To avoid any type of inconvenience the parents are expected to take utmost care in sending the required study material/lunch box/water bottle/short break snacks with the child itself in the morning.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Parents are advised to take responsibility to see that their ward attends classes regularly and as a rule does not seek exemption from attending daily classes. If there is any important occasion within the immediate family that falls on the working day and requires the presence of the family members whether for half day or full day leave of absence should be applied for beforehand by the parent by filling the details in the official note printed in the calendar. **Such permission as a rule will not be granted if the occasion coincides with the date of Examination or any other important event of the school.**

Parents will strictly avoid fixing **a routine doctor's checkup to their ward during working hours.**

- a) Punctuality and regular attendance is insisted upon. Leave of absence from school even for a few periods for attending marriages, funerals, etc., is not allowed. The general terms of excuse, 'for some business' 'for some ceremony' are not accepted.

- b) When a pupil has been absent from school without leave for some reason not foreseen, she/ he must on returning to school bring a **LEAVE NOTE** from his/her parents or guardian. Should the absence exceed three days the Leave Note must be forwarded to the Principal.
- c) Half day leave is granted in case of genuine reason only. The leave note should be compulsorily submitted in the morning itself to the Principal or Vice Principal.
- d) In the case of illness if the student is absent for more than 3 days the Leave Note along with the Medical Certificate must be forwarded to the principal.
- e) Special notice shall be taken of absence without permission from **TESTS AND EXAMINATIONS AND THE RE-OPENING OF CLASSES** after the holidays (June/October/December).
- f) Continuous absence for more than a week from school without permission will lead to the removal of the student's name from the school register. In such cases re-admission will be done only after payment of Rs.300/-. Re-admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The school authorities will have full discretion in this matter.

THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

The School Library of Carmel School is fully automated and well stocked with a record number of books, periodicals, magazines, journals national dailies etc. Students are advised to make optimum use of library resources, **maintain absolute SILENCE** and extend courtesy to the “temple of knowledge” by observing the following rules.....

1. The students of Grade VI to X are issued a library card and it is mandatory to bring the card when they enter the library.
2. The books are checked at the time of issuing and while returning.

3. Books to be returned on the due date only.
4. A fine of Rs. 10/ per week will be imposed if not returned on the due date.
5. If the card is lost, a new card will be issued after a payment of Rs.20/-
6. Students may borrow only one book on their library cards. The library card of a student will be cancelled if she/he is found lending it to others.
7. Books are issued for a week only.
8. Students are responsible for the books borrowed on their cards. The loss of books or any damage to them will have to be compensated for by the students. There is penalty for scribbling in a library book.
9. Books will be issued and returned only during the concerned library period. Do not leave the books in the classroom.
10. If a book is lost, it has to be replaced by a new one or its market price has to be paid.
11. The students are not allowed to bring their personal belonging or text and note books into the library.
12. If a Student wishes to keep the book longer even after the due date of returning it, she should renew the issue.
13. In order to avoid too much of rush in issuing and returning the books during exams, the students are requested to collect books between 10. 30a.m to 3. 15p.m with the permission of the respective teacher.
14. Students should maintain discipline and come in order to collect and return the books.
15. While leaving the library, chairs must be kept under the table without creating noise.

THE PARENT – TEACHER ASSOCIATION

1. All parents of the students on the roll of the School become members of the P.T. Association on payment of the membership fees Rs. 100/- (along with the school fees) per student in the academic year.
2. If a student has lost both her parents her legal guardian becomes the member of the Association. Parents who are abroad will appoint a guardian while admitting their child to this institution and give an official letter to the principal to this effect and the guardian will participate in the activities of the P.T.A. in the place of the parents. However only parents have an active voice to be elected as members of the Executive Committee of the P.T.A.
3. The Institution maintains the strong conviction that the ongoing efforts/ programs directed towards the growth and well-being of our students will become fruitful only when parents and teachers join hands, interact closely and act jointly in all educational endeavours.
4. The Parents/ Guardians have the responsibility to attend the General Body Meeting of the P.T.A., and the results session held after every Periodic Test/Term Exam. Besides they are expected to meet the teachers regularly and interact with them having the progress and the welfare of their children at heart.
5. The members elected for PTA Executive Committee should attend the meetings without fail and contribute actively for the growth and welfare of both students and the school.

CHILDREN’S SAFETY MEASURES

The school has undertaken all precautions to ensure safety and protection of your ward. We require your co-operation too in this regard. It’s our joint duty and responsibility to ensure the safety of our children. Hence we wish to create awareness among you and request you to do the following.

- Ensure that you know the whereabouts of your child at regular intervals.
- Start sharing your days experiences so that your children will also open up to you about their experiences.
- Observe your child's behavior; if changes are found find the reason.
- Educate your child about good touch and bad touch.
- Teach your child some important phone number specially **Child Helpline Number 1098 and Police 112** available 24x7.
- Ensure that your child has reached the class room.
- Drop and pick up your ward to and from school in time. Do not leave them unattended.
- Know your child's friends/ acquaintances and enlist their phone numbers and address.
- Teach your children to refuse gifts (sweets and chocolates) including money from strangers.
- Teach your children to report to you/ guardians and teachers if someone troubles them.
- Instruct your child not to indulge in personal information to strangers.
- Collect detailed information about the hobbies/ interests of child's activities.
- Your child's safety should be the first priority.
- If parents need to take their ward during school hours for any reason a prior written request letter must be submitted to the Principal and personally come to pick them up. Other than parents, if deputing any immediate relative (only in emergency cases) an authorization letter signed by the parents is a must to

pick up your ward. In all the above cases presenting the parents ID is mandatory.

- To avoid any type of inconvenience, please see that the books/ lunch bag/ short break snacks/ material required for CCA/ yoga classes etc. are sent with the child itself in the morning.
- Parents should always keep track of phone calls and messages being received by their wards on the mobiles and in case of instances where they receive instigating SMS, obscene pictures on mobile or through any other mode, such instances should be immediately reported to the nearest police station.
- You are advised not to send the child to school if the child is sick.
- Parents are strictly instructed not to allow their children to carry any electronic gadgets/ mobile/ camera to the school. If it is found with the children in the school, it will be a punishable act.
- Whenever your children go out to play with friends you need to find out who their friends are, and what kind of games they play, because young children sometimes sexually abuse themselves. You need to be observant.
- If your child complains about a particular person, or a situation, don't keep quiet about it. Take up the matter in an appropriate manner and find out the truth. Assure your children that you will defend them at any cost.
- Speak openly to your children about different unwelcome possibilities, wherever they go. It can be in your own house, in your relative's houses, in the school, in the playground, in the school bus or any such place where they are in the company of others.

- It is always advisable that you go through any new material like cartoons or CDs, you buy for them before they start watching them.
- Tell your girl child never to sit on the laps of boys/ men, no matter what the situation. Even a boy child needs to be warned about such situations. Please remember that it's not only girls, but also boys who become victims of sexual assaults.
- If a lively child suddenly becomes silent and withdrawn, you need to talk to your child patiently to find out if there is something going wrong.
- Tell your children never to accept a lift (free ride in a vehicle) offered by a stranger or any eatable or gift offered by a stranger. Ask them to avoid talking to any stranger as far as possible when they are alone.
- Educate your children about issues related to sex in an age-appropriate manner as they grow up. If you don't, they will gather the wrong kind of information from the wrong sources.
- As far as possible, never send your child (boy or girl) alone anywhere. Most children get molested or mistreated when they are left alone.

Camel milk's unique properties help to cure diabetes and autism, make it a valuable asset in our fight against prevalent health issues. Festivals such as the International Camel Festival at Bikaner, Pushkar Mela, Rann Utsav at Kutch and arts like GI tagged Usta Kala Crafts showcase the enduring cultural legacy of camels.

Camels serve as a source of diverse income avenues, including camel carts, leather works, bone works, hair products, camel based tourism, and camel dairy. Camel-based tourism activities offer economic

benefits to camel rearers and also from the sale of milk, and other by-products. It is the centre of attraction for tourists in destinations like the deserts of Rajasthan, Rann of Kutch, Nubra Valley of Ladakh, and seaside areas.

Camels play a vital role in advancing several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including no poverty, zero hunger, good health and well-being, gender equality, responsible consumption and production, climate action, and life on land. Comprehensive and collaborative efforts by Governments, policymakers, NGOs, research institutions, and the private sectors are essential in ensuring the success of the International Year of Camelids. Increased investment in research, outreach, and innovative practices are crucial. Policymakers must formulate regulations that promote the well-being of camels and their herders, addressing challenges such as shrinkages of browsing area, protecting common properties, accessibility to forest areas for browsing.

ICAR-National Research Centre on Camel is committed to celebrating the International Year of Camelids 2024 through awareness camps, workshops, developing policy papers, promotion of camel products and ecotourism.
